

**Christ the King
Sunday 21 November 2021**

Fr. Timothy writes:

I expect that I have worn you all out with the Mission! I so enjoyed doing it and really appreciated the full part that everyone played in it. I won't ask you to do it again, but there may be other excitements to participate in! This month kicks off with All Souls Day and we shall be commemorating all the faithful departed and especially by name. I am having a special service on Wednesday 3rd November at 10am and hope that you will be there to hear the names of your departed loved ones.

We shall be commemorating Remembrance Sunday on Sunday 14th November at 9.30am. The reason that service is a little earlier than normal is because I have to be at the Cenotaph in the village for 10.45am. These services are particularly important as we call to mind all who have been killed in wars and through violence. As we pray for universal peace, we need to cherish what it means to live in tranquillity, as we think about those people in the world who live in fear of their lives and who have witnessed violent atrocities. We think about how fortunate we all are, even though at this time we are waging war against the Corona Virus, which has devastated the world and put a stop to normal life as we know it.

It was good to welcome both the Bishop and the Archdeacon on Sunday 24th October and I was particularly grateful to the Bishop for celebrating and preaching at both of the morning services. The Archdeacon has, in my time, been an enormous support to S.Bridget's and I have particularly enjoyed his care and friendship.

And so we come to the end of the Church's year and move into a new one beginning on Advent Sunday. 28th November. As we prepare for the coming of Christmas, Advent is a penitential season and a time of self examination before the Christmas festivities. There is a lot of theology to take in from the various Sundays of Advent and powerful themes which take us through the history of God and his people. I love Advent and find that the way the weeks crescendo draws us into the wonderful story which unveils itself over Christmas. Our own personal preparations are all part of our making ready for Christ's birth, when it comes.

This month, Alison and friends are having four Christmas fayres, to raise money for our Church funds. The dates are 12th and 13th and 19th and 20th November. Hopefully they will be festive occasions and please help Alison with prizes and appropriate Christmas gifts.

My hope is that the coming season will bring about a healthier time around the United Kingdom and around the world. We have once more had a very testing year.

Readings for November 2021

All Saints

1st November

From its earliest days, the Church has recognised as its foundation stones those heroes of the faith whose lives have excited others to holiness and have assumed a communion with the Church on earth and the Church in heaven.

Celebrating the feast of All Saints' began in the fourth century. At first, it was observed on the Sunday after the feast of Pentecost; this was to link the disciples who received the gift of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, the 'foundation of the Church, with those who were martyrs, giving their lives as witnesses for the faith. In the eighth century, a pope dedicated a chapel to All Saints in St Peter's at Rome on 1st November.

Within a century, this day was observed in England and Ireland as All Saints' Day.


